Maggie Porter demonstrates outstanding leadership and exceptional character through her commitment to developing others. As a leader in youth programs at Lake Ripley Lanes and Prairie Lanes, she focuses on nurturing younger bowlers' growth. Her 13-year tenure in competitive junior bowling, combined with her 3.7+ GPA, shows her dedication to excellence both on and off the lanes.

Her leadership extends beyond bowling through her school's Leadership Council, DECA, and other activities. What sets Maggie apart is her champion mindset—she embraces challenges, accepts feedback, and remains coachable while maintaining composure under pressure.

Maggie is the 2024 Wisconsin High School Singles State Champion, US High School National Singles Champion, and 2024 Wisconsin Pepsi State Champion. She helped capture the 2022 Wisconsin High School State Team Championship.

Her competitive record includes being a 2x JBST champion, 2x District 4 champion, and 3x BYBT first-place finisher, with a top average of 216, high game of 299, and high series of 792.

STAR OF THE FUTURE



Joe's bowling accomplishments reflect consistent high-level performance. With a high series of 744 and high game of 279, he has competed at the highest levels, including multiple state tournament appearances. His competitive record features first place in the 2021-22 Division A Team event at the Wisconsin State Tournament and two additional second-place finishes.

Joe's community service to bowling is notable. He volunteered at 90% of UW football games concessions, worked fish fries and 50/50 drawings to support bowling programs, and contributed time to youth state championships. His three-year commitment to the Sun Prairie Junior bowling program, combined with his 3.7+ GPA, reflects his well-rounded character and genuine passion for advancing the sport.

MERITORIOUS SERVICE

A true ambassador for the sport of bowling, Don Aslakson has dedicated over five decades to advancing the game he has loved since age 13. His remarkable service spans military duty with the Army and Air National Guard, where bowling remained a constant companion throughout his career.

His leadership within the Madison Bowling Association stands as a testament to his commitment, serving 26 years as MBA Director and National Convention Delegate. He extended this dedication to the Madison Area USBC, serving as a director for six more years.

At the league level, his contributions include several roles as a league President or Secretary for three decades at Viking Lanes, Wildcat Lanes, Rude's Lanes, Badger Bowl (Stoughton) and the Wisconsin Traveling League.

His volunteerism extends beyond administrative duties. From scorekeeping and registration at tournaments to assisting during the historic merger, he has been indispensable.

A competitor of note, he participated in State and National Guard Tournaments, Badger State Games, and Senior Olympic competitions. Most proudly, he has mentored countless bowlers, some achieving Hall of Fame status themselves.

From his teenage years as a YABA League Secretary to decades of steadfast leadership, George Dorn exemplifies the dedication that forms the backbone of organized bowling. His service journey began at age 14 at Smitty's Lanes in Waunakee, where he learned the fundamentals of league administration that would guide his lifelong commitment to the sport.

His association leadership spans over three decades, serving 26 years as MBA Director and advancing to MBA Vice-President for six years. George's hands-on contributions extended far beyond boardroom duties, as manager of Lodi Bowl and coach of their youth bowlers, while serving as a league officer where needed.

His charitable spirit shines through his co-founding of two significant fundraising tournaments: the decade-long Zach's Buddies tournament for Cystic Fibrosis and the four-year Chris Rector Bowling Fundraising Tournament. These efforts showcased bowling's power to unite communities for meaningful causes.

Whether staffing tournaments, inspecting lanes, delivering supplies, or distributing awards, George approached every task with methodical care and quiet competence. His reliability became a cornerstone of successful association tournament operations.

DISTINGUISHED PERFORMANCE

One of the most prolific titlists in Madison Area USBC history, Michael Hoffman has established himself as a perennial threat and champion across multiple decades of tournament play.

His remarkable tournament record includes 33 total titles at the time of induction - 22 Madison Area Scratch Tour, 10 city, and one state. Notably, he has five All Events, four Team, and one Singles title among his Madison Area USBC Open collection, where he averaged 247 while amassing those wins.

Additional honors include three Henry Hitter 3-Person Team championships, one Wisconsin Scratch Bowlers Tour title, and numerous top finishes in a variety of high level scratch competitions. His excellence has been recognized with four Jim Grady awards, cementing his status as one of the association's elite performers.

Beyond statistics, he exemplifies the finest qualities of sportsmanship. He is fiercely determined and focused, yet gracious in both victory and defeat. His deep respect for the game and its history, combined with his role as a family man guiding the next generation, makes him an inspiring mentor for the sport.
